
Richmond Library Makerspace Artist in Residence Program

Expression of interest



The City of Yarra is inviting artists to submit an Expression of Interest for a residency at the Richmond Library Makerspace – 415 Church St, Richmond.

Overview

Yarra City Council is seeking Expressions of Interest for the Richmond Library Artist in Residency program. The residency program offers free access to digital equipment, technical support and a shared working space located above Richmond Library during library opening hours Wednesday – Sunday, as negotiated which includes some evenings. Two residencies will be offered for a period of up to three months. The resident's project should include a public outcome.

About the program

The Richmond Library Artist-in-Residence program is designed to provide access to digital equipment and a working space for an artist to focus on their own practice. Participants are encouraged to explore new ideas, self-direct their research and time, and cultivate new directions in their work. The program would particularly suit video editing, sound recording, sound design, podcasting, projection mapping, digital fabrication, photo editing, live streaming, interactive media, design, small-scale textiles and post-production.

The program encourages experimentation via access to a suite of digital technology in the Richmond Library Makerspace. Facilities include a 3D printer, laser cutter, sound recording equipment, film/photo scanner, cameras, lighting, a MS101 keyboard synthesiser, programmable embroidery machines, Cricut Maker, green screen and studio backdrops, Arduino kits, Adobe Suite, Ableton, Pro Tools, Touch Designer, Blender, Q-bas and a computer with a good graphics card capable of 3D rendering. Knowledgeable staff are available to provide limited technical assistance with developing your project. The Richmond Makerspace is a small, shared space at Richmond Library. The space would be available Wed-Sun during Library opening hours as negotiated. There may be some limitations given that space and equipment is shared.

We require a public outcome from your residency. This could include an artist talk, workshop, screening, exhibition, sound installation, podcast, performance or other event. Possible venues include Richmond Theatrette. The outcome can occur during or after your residency and is to be agreed upon in consultation with Council staff.

What length of residency is available?

This program is designed for a period of up to three months.

The available residency period is 24 July 2023 - 24 October 2023

Some variation may be considered.

Who should apply?

This residency is for an artist/ or duo whose work would benefit from access to a professional suite of technology and would be happy to work in an edit suite/podcast studio that is acoustically treated and up to date with the latest specifications for podcast content creation and postproduction. There will be an induction process but some experience will be useful as will be the ability to problem solve independently. The artist will need to deliver a public outcome from their residency.

What does the program offer?

The program offers free working space, some technical assistance and access to our technical facilities. Please note that, with the exception of Zoom recorders, equipment cannot be taken offsite. Equipment includes:

Submission Guidelines

Artists may submit one proposal only as part of the Expression of Interest process. If your application is for a duo/ two people using the space, please select one artist to complete the application (this person will be the contact), identifying both artists involved. Proposals will be assessed on the following criteria:

- Innovative art practice;
- The benefit to the artist of access to our facilities;
- Our capacity to support your project;
- A public outcome during or at the completion of the residency;
- The capacity of the artist to successfully complete the project;
- Priority will be given to applicants who can demonstrate that the technology and space will be important in the development of their practice.

This 3-month residency is due to commence 24 July 2023.

There is an expectation that the resident will deliver a public outcome either during or after the residency. This could include but is not limited to an artist talk, workshop, screening, exhibition, sound installation, podcast, performance or other event. Possible venues include Richmond Theatrette and other venues in Yarra.

Additional support such as promotion/publicity will be provided by Yarra Arts and Yarra Libraries through their website, newsletter and social media.

Yarra Council support should be acknowledged in program outcomes.

Timelines

Applications open Monday 29 May 2023 and will remain open until 11.59pm Friday 7 July 2023.

Applicants should expect to be notified of the outcome by the outcome by 24 July 2023.

Eligibility

- The applicant should be able to demonstrate the value of the residency program for their creative practice.
- Applicants need to propose a public outcome or program during or at the conclusion of their residency. If this is a physical outcome this must take place in the City of Yarra.
- If your project involves working with young people you will require a current Working with Children Check.

- A completed application form via the Smarty Grants portal link
- Images or links to website or video of previous or proposed works (up to 3 x A4 pages) via the Smarty Grants portal
- A CV (maximum 2 pages) via the Smarty Grants portal
- Any other relevant support material via the Smarty Grants portal

When to submit:

Applications must be received by 11.59pm Friday 7 July 2023.
